While the author has focussed on research, he has been active on a number of other fronts. He has been on the Board of Directors of the McLuhan Program. He has organised conferences

and summer schools mainly on culture. He is concerned with open source developments, with the potentials of networks for creativity, and with privacy on the Internet. He has had projects on new Media with the Canadian Heritage Information Network (CHIN), has acted as advisor on a number of committees and think-tanks ranging from local (Heerlen) and provincial (e.g. Owl Television) to national (CHIN, SSSHRC, Couchiching Conference, Canada ; NWO, Netherlands) and international (European Commission). He was the youngest President of the Canadian Universities Society of Great Britain, was a Trustee of the Canada Scholarship at Cambridge. He is a lover of music and an enthusiastic traveller.
